

SAFETY

• The condition of being safe from undergoing or causing harm, injury or loss.

definition

"Measures taken in advance of an emergency to reduce the loss of life and property and to protect a nation" (and your adult care center)

Preparedness by U.S. Department of Homeland Security/FEMA


"a continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercising, evaluating, and taking corrective action in an effort to ensure effective coordination during incident response"



What is an Emergency Preparedness Plan?

A written PLAN that assists in determining and planning for potential emergency situations and appropriate responses to them.



DHS Recommendation for Levels of a Plan

1

Strategic

which includes policy objectives and overall guidance

2

Operational

which includes roles and responsibilities, tasks, integration and actions



Tactical

which includes personnel, equipment and resource management








