Sexual Orientation/Gender Identity

GENDER IDENTITY IS NOT THE SAME AS

SEXUAL ORIENTATION

Everyone has both a gender identity and also a sexual orientation

Your gender identity is your personal view of your own gender.

Your sexual orientation is your personal view of who you are attracted to.

Transgender people can be straight, gay, lesbian or bisexual – just the same as everyone else!

Social Isolation: Review

LONELINESS

1 million O po al

Over **1 million** older people say they are always or often feel lonely

People with a high degree of loneliness are twice as likely to develop Alzheimer's as people with a low degree of loneliness



Loneliness can be as harmful for our health as smoking 15 cigarettes a day



Nearly half (49%) of all people aged 75 and over live alone

9% of older people feel trapped in their own home

INTIMACY AND SEXUAL EXPRESSION



Sexual Expression...

- Ranges from hand holding to intercourse
- Is as simple as a way someone dresses
- Is an outlet for anxiety
- Minimizes loneliness

Sexuality and Intimacy is fundamental to an individual and intrinsic to a person's self and well being.

At any age we require:

- Companionship
- Intimacy
- Love

A basic human need 1

Intimacy: A close familiar and usually affectionate or loving personal relationship with another person or group." 2

Sexuality: Pertaining to copulation, having sex or involving sex, implying or symbolizing erotic desires, capable of sexual feelings."



Acceptable expression in adult day?



Evidence suggests that we are accepting of light forms of expression such as:

- Holding Hands
- Stroking
- Kissing



Elaine and Patricia are partners who lived together as a couple for several years. Patricia, however, was diagnosed with MCI (mild cognitive impairment). Elaine managed to support Patricia at home for over a year, but when Elaine started having her own health problems, she felt she could no longer cope with the physical demands of Patricia's care.

It was agreed by Patricia and Elaine that Patricia needed additional care and support. Patricia started attending a local day support program. From time to time, Elaine stops by to check in and visit during the day. They sit and hold hands. Often when Elaine leaves, she will give Patricia a kiss. Recently, one of your colleagues expressed disgust and a religious objection to seeing Elaine and Patricia together.

What do you do?





- Three out of every four adults agree with the statement, "Americans suffer from skin hunger."
- More Americans live alone than ever before.
- One in four Americans reports not having not a single person to talk to about important issues.
- Loneliness among American adults has increased 16 percent in the last decade.
